SPEED CLASSIC CAPE TOWN HILLCLIMB 25 AND 26 OCTOBER

Entry applications for the inaugural Speed Classic Cape Town are open and will close on August 15. Described as a "pure test of driver skill and machine performance", the course will challenge competitors with a winding 2.1km climb up Philip Kgosana Drive at the foot of Table Mountain. Entry is by application only, with a committee selecting a limited grid of 80 entrants to ensure the highest level of competition. Classic Car Saturday on October 25 is dedicated to vintage machinery and King of the Mountain Sunday on October 26 is set aside for more contemporary cars. Entry fees start at R10,000 for Classic Car Saturday and The King of the Mountain Shootout is R15,000.
